Thank you those of you who saw my request and were able to pray about the Lords debate on Tuesday evening considering Lord McColl's child trafficking guardian amendment (to ensure all children who have been rescued from trafficking situations have someone to represent their interests). It was not backed by the Government so was lost by fifteen votes, which is disappointing news. The government spokesperson Baroness Northover suggested guardians could make matters worse because other professionals may think "they don't need to concern themselves as much about a traffic child because their guardian is looking after them"'. However, there are still reasons to be hopeful - and after all, Wilberforce's campaign against slavery took him decades...
